



## McGill University Integrated Program in Neuroscience:

### **MSc and PhD Programs in Neuroscience** ([www.mcgill.ca/ipn](http://www.mcgill.ca/ipn))

- The Integrated Program in Neuroscience (IPN) is an inter-disciplinary, inter-departmental graduate program, focused on producing world-class neuroscientists.
- McGill University has a rich history of achievements in neuroscience and is [ranked as one of the top 20 universities in the world](#).
- One of the largest Neuroscience graduate programs in North America, with approximately 280 MSc and PhD students and more than 160 professors.

### **Ph.D. Rotation Program** ([www.mcgill.ca/ipn/prospective/rotation/](http://www.mcgill.ca/ipn/prospective/rotation/))

- For students with multiple interests in neuroscience, who wish to try out different labs in their first year before committing to a single supervisor.
- Entry each September only, for a select group of talented students. (~5 students admitted.)
- GPA, abstracts and publications, reference letters, and application essays are all taken into consideration. Final selection is made on a per-case basis by the IPN Rotation Committee.

### **Application Deadlines** (<http://www.mcgill.ca/ipn/apply/>)

- **For January entry** into the regular program the deadlines are September 15<sup>th</sup> for non-Canadians and October 15<sup>th</sup> for Canadians and residents of Canada.
- **For September entry** into the regular program the deadlines are March 15<sup>th</sup> for non-Canadians and June 1<sup>st</sup> for Canadians and residents of Canada.
- **Students interested in the IPN Rotation Program** should apply by its January 31<sup>st</sup> deadline for entry in September of the same year. Please contact [ipn.admissions@mcgill.ca](mailto:ipn.admissions@mcgill.ca) to express your interest in the Rotation Program when you apply.

### **Stipend**

- IPN supervisors agree to provide at least the minimum recommended stipend for the students.
- IPN provides Rotation Program students with a competitive stipend during their rotation year.
- All students are strongly encouraged to apply for external sources of funding.
